I started off the month with lots of events planned for the coming weeks in the run up to Easter, unfortunately these have now had to be cancelled but below is a list of the activities that were able to happen before the lock down occurred.

Please see below my report for February and March:

- St Peter's Academy Assembly, Raunds – the value was 'Forgiveness' and Jon and I took the assembly together. We did a little skit together where I had broken Jon's favourite mug. We discussed with the children why Jon should forgive me even if he doesn't feel like he wants to straight away. We looked at the story of Nathan in 2 Samuel and what Jesus says about forgiveness.
- Messy Church, Raunds – our theme for February was God's love. We shared the story of David and Jonathan and their deep love for each other as friends. We then had a team game of 'spreading God's love' around. Each team had to transfer little confetti hearts from bowl to bowl, the first team to finish was the winner. However, there was considerable cheating within the teams especially from Rev. Jon!! I think most teams ended up disqualified with only Hazel being very diligent with the confetti hearts. Lots of laughs and giggles ensued. I'm fairly sure that I am still finding the confetti hearts around the church!
- St Peter's Academy Assembly, Raunds – this was the final assembly with the value of 'Forgiveness'. I decided to hold a quiz to see what they could remember about all the different Bible stories that we had covered on forgiveness. The children were amazing with the amount of knowledge that they understood. I was very impressed. It was a fun way to end that value.

- New Wine, Harrogate – Rev. Jon, Wendy and I went to the New Wine Leaders Conference in Harrogate for 3 days. This was a great way of people from many different faith backgrounds to come together to worship the lord, pray together and share resources and ideas. We were able to attend some fascinating and inspiring seminars which has given us all some great tips and inspiration to implement useful things within our own Benefice.

That was basically the last event that we were able to attend/run due to COVID-19 Coronavirus. This basically means now that schools are mainly closed (except for key workers' children and vulnerable children) that I am not able to plan my usual events for the children and families of the Benefice. This means my work needs to shift its focus so Rev. Jon, Wendy and I have turned Jon's study into a command centre so that we can work out how best to serve the needs of our community through this difficult time. Wendy has produced a card with a prayer on one side and contact details on the other so people can contact us if they need help with shopping or collecting prescription medication etc. or even if they need a phone call to talk to someone. We have been in contact with people who can help with practical needs or if people are in isolation they can help by being a phone contact. We have been compiling a list (if you are able to offer help in any way please do get in contact). Over the next few days we will be delivering these cards to hopefully each house in our Benefice (thank you to all those people helping us deliver the cards). It is important that our communities know that we are still here for them and that we are praying for them too. If you or someone that you know needs help please do get in touch and we can make sure that your needs are met.

The next few weeks and months will be a challenge but God will provide us with ways to help one another. Until next month stay safe and please remember that you can light a candle at 7pm on Sunday evening in your own homes and join us in prayer.
